EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (EC-10: 2025–2027)

The present Executive Committee (EC-10) assumed office in September 2025 for a two-year term up to August 2027. During the year under review, the Committee continued the past tradition of GAABESU to strengthen alumni engagement, expand student support programmes, promote heritage conservation, and enhance the Association's contribution towards the development of IEST Shibpur.

MEMBERSHIP STATUS

GAABESU currently has 2,321 Life Members, including 118 new members enrolled during the year. The Student Membership scheme introduced last year received an encouraging response, with nearly 300 students enrolling.

Although GAABESU communicates with all the alumni virtually through its website, social media platforms, and email, members are requested to motivate fellow alumni to become Life Members and participate in the activities of the Association.

The Association's routine operational expenditure is presently met primarily through bank interest of Life Membership subscriptions and voluntary contributions from a limited number of alumni. Funds donated for specific purposes are utilized exclusively for those designated objectives.

Consequently, the Association is presently experiencing a shortage of unrestricted operational funds required for its day-to-day activities. Establishment of a dedicated Operational Fund therefore remains an important priority for the coming year.

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT REPORT

The Accounts together with the Audited Financial Statements for the financial year 2025–26 have already been circulated to all members through Email. The Treasurer Malay Niyogi will present the salient features of the audited accounts during this Meeting.

In accordance with the resolution adopted at the previous Annual General Meeting, M/s Debasis Bandyopadhyay, Chartered Accountants, were appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the Association for the financial year 2025–26.

The Executive Committee is pleased to record its appreciation for the valuable guidance provided by the Auditors in resolving some issues flagged out earlier. We are happy to report that the Association has no significant pending Income Tax issues.

The EC would also like to inform you that long pending refunds from the Income Tax authority, which were kept on hold for a long time, have been received during this year after clarification and resolving all the points.

PUBLICITY

Alumni Link, the GAABESU Newsletter, continues to highlight important activities of the Association, achievements of alumni, developments within the Institute, and matters of interest to the global alumni community.

In addition, GAABESU's activities are regularly disseminated through its official Facebook and YouTube platforms, thereby strengthening communication and engagement with alumni across India and abroad.

The Executive Committee places on record its appreciation for the dedicated efforts of the Publicity Sub-Committee in maintaining these communication channels and ensuring timely dissemination of information.

GAABESU WEBSITE

The upgraded website became fully operational from September 2025. Besides uploading various programmes and news, the Scholarship Application Process for the academic session 2025–26 was successfully conducted online through this portal.

The GAABESU website has significantly improved communication with alumni, simplified membership management, facilitated scholarship administration, and strengthened the Association's digital presence.

The Executive Committee gratefully acknowledges the generous financial support received from the 1988 Batch and the GAABESU USA Foundation, whose contributions made this important digital transformation possible.

ACTIVITIES OF THE ASSOCIATION

The Association's programmes during the year spanned scholarships and awards, travel grants, tuition assistance, emergency relief, Global Alumni Day, seminars and webinars, heritage restoration and infrastructure development, and a range of other commemorative and academic initiatives, detailed below.

1. Scholarship Programme, Alumni Fellowship for Excellence, Research Awards and Debate Competition Awards

Among the various initiatives undertaken by GAABESU, the Scholarship Programme continues to remain its flagship activity. With generous and sustained support from alumni across the globe, the Association has been able to significantly expand its financial assistance to deserving students through scholarships, admission grants, book grants, and other educational support.

The Alumni Fellowship for Excellence (AFE) recognizes students who have demonstrated outstanding merit in academics, sports, leadership and other co-curricular activities. GAABESU is continuing its Research Awards to encourage excellence in research and innovation among students.

The Scholarship and Award Distribution Ceremony for the academic session 2025–26 was successfully held on 14 February 2026 at the Alumni Seminar Hall, IEST Shibpur. The yearly Debate Competition was actively participated in by the students; details appear later in this report. A detailed report of the programme was subsequently circulated to all members and is also available on the GAABESU website.

The names of all donors and recipients were attached with this report and published on the GAABESU website, in accordance with the Association's established practice of maintaining transparency and acknowledging the generous contributions of its alumni.

2. Travel Grant Programme

The Travel Grant Programme is intended exclusively for the students of IEST Shibpur and provides partial financial assistance to enable them to participate in prestigious national and international conferences, seminars, research paper presentations, innovative design competitions, international student summits, and similar academic events. Assistance is also extended to students receiving international awards, provided the research work has been undertaken at IEST Shibpur or the applicant is the principal investigator.

Each application is considered only after recommendation by the respective Head of Department and approval by GAABESU. During the year, the following Travel Grants were sanctioned:

- ₹5,500 to Rahufur Rahaman, a fourth-semester postgraduate student in Geotechnical Engineering (Enrollment No. 2023CEM026), to participate in the 10th Indian Young Geotechnical Engineers Conference (IYGEC 2025) at IIT Indore, 11–12 March 2025 — paper accepted for oral presentation.
- ₹25,000 to Sharif Hossain, Ph.D. Scholar in Transportation Engineering, Department of Civil Engineering, to present two research papers at the Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies (EASTS 2025) Conference in Indonesia, 1–3 September 2025.
- ₹40,000 to Gourab Banerjee, Ph.D. Scholar, Department of Electrical Engineering, whose paper was accepted at INTERMAG 2026, organized by the IEEE Magnetics Society in Manchester, United Kingdom, 13–17 April 2026.

3. Tuition Fee Assistance

Apart from scholarships, GAABESU also provides financial assistance to students facing genuine economic hardship to enable them to continue their education without interruption. During the year, assistance was extended to the following students:

- ₹37,700 to Soumili Biswas (Enrollment No. 2025CTM016), an M.Sc. student of the School of Community Science and Technology (SOCSAT), towards boarding and food expenses for six months.
- ₹46,500 to Aniruddha Pal (Enrollment No. 2025HCM015), a first-year MTech. student in Biomedical Engineering under the Centre for Healthcare Science and Technology (CHST), towards his Semester-II tuition fees.

Subsequently, Mr. Aniruddha Pal sought further financial assistance of ₹2,82,100 to support his internship at IIT Delhi together with payment of his third-semester fees. Mr. Prabal Mukherji (1963 Batch) came forward to sponsor the initial phase of his internship at IIT Delhi. The Executive Committee records its sincere appreciation for this generous gesture.

4. Emergency Fund

The Emergency Fund stood at approximately ₹15 lakh, together with a further ₹1.50 lakh contributed by the 1987 Batch during the COVID period. During 2025–26, medical emergency assistance was provided to the following alumni and their family members:

- ₹5,38,000 to Animesh Mandal (2015 Batch), towards treatment of his infant daughter, Anshika Mandal, diagnosed with the rare genetic disorder Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) Type I.
- ₹1,90,340 to Dipankar Samanta (Mechanical Engineering, 1981 Batch), towards treatment of himself and his wife, Mrs. Keya Samanta, undergoing prolonged treatment for acute tuberculosis infection and a serious spinal condition.
- ₹2,00,000 to Mr. Durgadas Banerjee (Mechanical Engineering, 1974 Batch), towards treatment for prostate cancer.

- ₹1,00,000 to Mr. Jagadish Panda (Information Technology, 2005 Batch), towards treatment for an aggressive form of cancer requiring chemotherapy, immunotherapy and major surgery.

The Executive Committee expresses its sincere gratitude to all donors whose generosity has enabled GAABESU to extend timely assistance during periods of serious medical distress.

A separate fund had earlier been created by the 1957 Batch to support their batchmate, Sri Pranab Lahiri, during his prolonged illness. Following his demise, the batch decided that the unutilized balance of approximately ₹92,000 should be transferred towards restoration of the roof of the Heritage Clock Tower, in accordance with the wishes of the donors.

Considering the practical challenges of operating a separate Emergency Fund, the Executive Committee has decided that available balance resources will be utilized judiciously for deserving cases.

5. Global Alumni Day 2025

The 12th Global Alumni Day of GAABESU was celebrated with great enthusiasm on Sunday, 28 December 2025, at the Flag Hoisting Ground of IEST Shibpur, continuing the long-standing tradition of holding the event on the last Sunday of December to facilitate maximum participation by alumni from India and abroad.

The celebrations witnessed the participation of nearly 450 alumni and their family members, representing graduating batches from 1953 to 2024. A particularly memorable feature was the presence of Sri Ashish Sengupta (Civil Engineering, 1953), the senior-most alumnus in attendance, who travelled from the United States to share his cherished memories of student life.

The inaugural session was graced by Prof. V. M. S. R. Murthy, Director, IEST Shibpur; Prof. Anirban Gupta, Dean (International Relations and Alumni Affairs); Prof. Arun Deb; Prof. Netai Ch. Dey, Convener; and Sri Amitabha Datta, President, GAABESU.

Following a minute's silence in memory of departed alumni, the President welcomed the gathering and emphasized the importance of strengthening alumni engagement and reinforcing the enduring relationship between the Institute and its global alumni fraternity. The Director and the Dean highlighted the Institute's recent academic achievements and ongoing infrastructure development, acknowledging the significant contributions of GAABESU and alumni worldwide.

The Secretary, Sri Prosenjit Chakraborty, presented a comprehensive overview of the Association's activities during the year, covering scholarships, student support programmes, alumni engagement initiatives and the need for greater participation by younger alumni.

A special felicitation was accorded to Prof. Goutam Chattopadhyay (Electronics & Telecommunication Engineering, 1987), Distinguished Scientist at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) and Professor at the California Institute of Technology (Caltech), who shared inspiring recollections of his student life and professional journey.

During the inaugural programme, the Director formally released the 2025 Special Issue of Alumni Link, the Association's annual family magazine, and an anonymous donation of books valued at ₹1 lakh for the Department of Mechanical Engineering was announced.

The post-inaugural programme included the traditional Open House Session, offering alumni the opportunity to exchange ideas and suggestions for strengthening the Association and supporting the Institute.

One of the major attractions of the day was a special performance of “Hattamalar Deshe” by the renowned theatre group Shatabdi, organized to commemorate the birth centenary of the legendary playwright and distinguished alumnus Sudhindra (Badal) Sarkar (BE Civil 1947). The celebrations also featured a traditional Bengali lunch, book stalls showcasing publications authored by alumni, exhibitions of student projects, and guided campus tours by battery-operated e-rickshaws.

The evening concluded with an outstanding cultural programme coordinated by Sri Indranil Sen with the generous support of the GAABESU Qatar Alumni Chapter, featuring the thematic presentation “Milestones” and a musical performance by Anwesha & The Alternates.

The Organising Committee expresses its sincere gratitude to all alumni, distinguished guests, volunteers, sponsors, advertisers and the authorities of IEST Shibpur for their wholehearted support. The Executive Committee records its special appreciation to Prof. Netai Ch. Dey, Convener, and Sri Vinod Kumar Singh, Joint Convener, for their tireless efforts and successful mobilisation of sponsorships.

A detailed report on the celebrations has already been circulated to all members and is available on the GAABESU website.

6. Seminar, Webinar and Alumni Networking Initiatives

GAABESU continues to promote professional interaction and knowledge sharing among alumni and students through lectures, seminars, webinars and networking initiatives.

A particularly noteworthy initiative has been the IEST Alumni Networking Initiative, launched by GAABESU-USA in July 2023 through a dedicated team of alumni volunteers. The project has since organized a series of highly successful webinars covering diverse professional, technological and academic subjects, facilitating meaningful interaction among alumni, faculty members, researchers, students and industry professionals across the globe.

Recordings of these sessions are available through the official GAABESU YouTube Channel, enabling alumni and students to access the lectures at their convenience. The Initiative has also established several Special Interest Groups (SIGs) to provide career guidance and mentoring for present students and recent graduates.

During the coming year, the Initiative proposes to organize additional programmes in emerging areas such as Semiconductors, Entrepreneurship, and other frontier technologies, thereby strengthening alumni engagement while supporting the professional development of students.

Certificates of Appreciation were issued by the GAABESU Office to all present students involved in various activities during the year in support of the Alumni Networking Initiative, jointly issued by GAABESU and the GAABESU USA Chapter.

7. Heritage Restoration and Campus Infrastructure Development Projects

One of the most significant achievements during the year has been GAABESU's active participation in the preservation of the Institute's heritage and the improvement of its academic infrastructure.

The Institute is presently preparing a comprehensive Campus Master Plan, which envisages major opportunities for alumni participation in heritage conservation, campus development, environmental improvement and academic infrastructure enhancement. Under this Master Plan, the historic Clock Tower and its surrounding precinct have been identified as priority heritage assets requiring conservation and development.

Recognizing the importance of alumni participation, the Director of IIST Shibpur invited GAABESU to assume a leading role in implementing selected heritage restoration and campus development projects, with the Institute assuming responsibility for their long-term maintenance upon completion.

Accordingly, the Director requested GAABESU to undertake restoration of the heritage timber roof of the iconic Clock Tower together with beautification of its surrounding area. While the Central Public Works Department (CPWD) has undertaken structural rehabilitation of the masonry portion, restoration of the specialized heritage timber roof falls outside the scope of the CPWD contract.

The Executive Committee, at its 133rd Meeting, resolved to execute this highly specialized heritage conservation work through M/s Design and Display, an agency experienced in heritage restoration. A series of coordination meetings were subsequently held involving the Dean (Planning & Development), Dean (International Relations & Alumni Affairs), Institute Engineer – IWD, President – GAABESU, other Executive Committee Members, and Dr Himadri Guha (Heritage Advisor to CPWD, an alumnus of Civil Engineering, 1973), together with other concerned officials of the Institute.

It was agreed that the extensive scaffolding erected by CPWD for the masonry restoration would also be made available for the timber roof restoration works, reducing project costs and ensuring proper coordination between the two agencies. Formal Record Notes of Discussions were prepared after each meeting and preserved for future reference.

Simultaneously, GAABESU has undertaken planning and design of the proposed Clock Tower Park, transforming the surrounding precinct into an attractive heritage landscape. The restoration agency commenced preliminary work during the last week of July 2026, while CPWD initiated erection of the steel tubular scaffolding required for access to the Clock Tower roof. Subject to completion of the scaffolding works, restoration of the timber roof is expected to be completed within approximately 45 days.

At the same Executive Committee Meeting, GAABESU also approved a proposal — originally suggested by Dr Arun Deb (BE Civil 1957) — for comprehensive modernization of the audio system of the Civil Engineering Department's Seminar Hall. Following evaluation of proposals from several agencies, the work was awarded to Audio Visual Vibe for supply, installation, testing and commissioning of a modern sound system using premium SONODYNE equipment.

Total estimated expenditure on these three flagship initiatives: approximately ₹45 lakh (excluding certain associated implementation costs).

GAABESU has appealed to alumni throughout the world to participate generously in these important projects. Alumni batches, regional chapters, affinity groups and individual alumni have also been invited to sponsor specific components of the works. As a mark of appreciation, donors contributing ₹50,000 or US\$500 and above will be suitably acknowledged at the respective project sites.

The Executive Committee is pleased to note the enthusiastic response already received from alumni across India and overseas, and is confident that, with the continued support of the global alumni fraternity and the Institute, these projects will be completed successfully — leaving a lasting legacy for future generations while further strengthening the bond between IEST Shibpur and its alumni.

8. Other Activities

In addition to its flagship programmes on scholarships, alumni engagement and campus development, GAABESU continued to organize several academic, professional and commemorative events during the year, celebrating the achievements of distinguished alumni and faculty while promoting intellectual interaction among alumni, students and the Institute community.

8.1 Prof. P. K. Roy Memorial Lecture

In collaboration with the Department of Civil Engineering, GAABESU organized the 6th Prof. Pradip Kumar Roy Memorial Lecture on 24 March 2026 at the Civil Engineering Department Seminar Hall. The lecture series, instituted in honour of Late Prof. Pradip Kumar Roy (Civil Engineering, 1965) — an outstanding alumnus, distinguished teacher and respected academician who passed away in 2013 — was initiated at the suggestion of his former students and batchmates, and is supported through an endowment administered by GAABESU.

The 2026 lecture was delivered by Shri Rupak Sarkar (Civil Engineering, 1981), an eminent civil engineer with extensive professional experience in India and abroad, on “Tunnelling Engineering,” and was highly appreciated by the audience. The programme, opened by Shri Amitabha Datta, President, GAABESU, was attended by the

speaker's batchmates, senior GAABESU members, Deans of the Institute, the Head of Civil Engineering, faculty and a large number of students, filling the Seminar Hall to capacity.

8.2 Paramesh Ranjan Dhar Memorial Debate Competition

GAABESU continued its long-standing tradition of organizing the Paramesh Ranjan Dhar Memorial Debate Competition, instituted in memory of Late Paramesh Ranjan Dhar (Civil Engineering, 1957), an illustrious alumnus and accomplished debater, following an endowment established by his friends and batchmates.

The 6th edition was held on 26 March 2026 at the Alumni Seminar Hall, attended by the Dean (International Relations & Alumni Affairs), members of Mr. Dhar's family, distinguished guests, his friends and batchmates, senior GAABESU members, faculty and students. Mr. Syama Prasad Datta spoke on the life and contributions of Late Paramesh Ranjan Dhar, while Dr Arun Deb highlighted the objectives of the competition.

Motion: “In the opinion of the House, climate commitments have become non-relevant in present geopolitical interests.”

The debate attracted 16 student participants, whose quality of argument and presentation was highly appreciated by the judging panel — Prof. Lt. Col. Anjan Ghosh, Prof. Apurba Sarkar (Professor-in-Charge, DebSoc Society) and Prof. Madhumita Roy — from among whom four outstanding debaters were selected for awards.

8.3 “Legends & Legacies” Lecture Series — Department of Electrical Engineering

GAABESU, in collaboration with the Department of Electrical Engineering, continues to organise the “Legends & Legacies” Lecture Series, commemorating the contributions of distinguished former teachers and Heads of the Department. Following the inaugural lecture in August 2024 in memory of Dr Sankar Kumar Sen, the Second Lecture was organized on 6 February 2026 at the Alumni Seminar Hall, honouring Prof. Naresh Chandra Majumdar and Prof. Jayanta Kumar Sen.

The invited speaker, Dr Debaprasad Kastha, Professor, IIT Kharagpur and alumnus of Electrical Engineering (1987 Batch), delivered a lecture on “Distributed Generation — Opportunities and Challenges.” The programme, opened by Prof. Aparajita Sengupta, Head of Electrical Engineering, and Prof. Anirban Gupta, Dean (International Relations & Alumni Affairs), included recollections by Dr C. R. Mahata (1960 EE) and Prof. Gautam Bandyopadhyay (1976 EE). The speaker was introduced by Shri Prosenjit Chakraborty (1987 EE), Secretary, GAABESU, and felicitated with an Uttorio and a commemorative memento; the vote of thanks was delivered by Prof. Kaushik Mukherjee.

The Executive Committee is pleased to note the growing popularity of this lecture series and intends to continue organizing similar programmes in memory of other legendary teachers of the Institute.

8.4 Faculty Research Awards

GAABESU is pleased to announce a significant new initiative recognizing excellence in research among the faculty members of IEST Shibpur. Dr Tapas Som (Mechanical Engineering, 1971 Batch), presently based in the United States, has generously committed financial support of ₹4.50 lakh per annum to institute three annual Faculty Research Awards, commencing from the academic session 2026–27.

Awardees will be selected on the recommendation of a Selection Committee comprising nominees of the Institute and representatives of GAABESU, with members from IEST Shibpur and Jadavpur University serving based on nominations by the respective Deans. A formal Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Dr Som and GAABESU has already been executed, and the Selection Committee constituted with the donor's approval.

Dr Som has also proposed that his earlier Young Researcher Fellowship (YRF) scheme, inactive in recent years owing to a lack of nominations from the Institute, be integrated with this new initiative. The Executive Committee believes this generous endowment will significantly strengthen the culture of research excellence at IEST Shibpur.

MAJOR ALUMNI CONTRIBUTIONS

One of the most encouraging developments during the year has been the extraordinary philanthropic support extended by distinguished alumni towards the advancement of IEST Shibpur. These landmark contributions reaffirm the deep and enduring bond that alumni continue to share with their alma mater and their commitment to strengthening its future.

Water Research Centre and Sustainable Infrastructure Development

GAABESU is proud to acknowledge two historic donations that will significantly enhance the Institute's research capabilities and academic excellence.

Dr Arun Deb (Civil Engineering, 1957 Batch), former President of GAABESU and an internationally renowned expert in water and wastewater engineering, has generously donated US\$1 million (approximately ₹8.6 crore) to establish a world-class center dedicated to water and environmental studies at IEST Shibpur, drawing upon more than six decades of distinguished contributions in teaching, research and consultancy across the world.

In another remarkable gesture of philanthropy, Prof. Sudhangshu Sekhar Chakraborty (Civil Engineering, 1957 Batch), a distinguished civil engineer based in New Delhi and a classmate of Dr Deb, has donated ₹10 crore towards promoting sustainable infrastructure development at the Institute.

The Institute has announced the establishment of two multidisciplinary research centers through these generous contributions:

- Arun and Dhriti Deb Centre for Water and Environmental Studies (ADDCWES)
- Chirasree Centre for Sustainable Infrastructure Development (CCSID)

These Centers are expected to promote interdisciplinary research, develop advanced academic programmes, encourage innovation and entrepreneurship, and provide solutions to emerging national and global challenges — reinforcing the long-standing tradition of alumni giving back to their alma mater and strengthening the Institute's position as one of India's premier engineering institutions.

As we present this Annual Report before the members at the 19th Annual General Meeting, we do so with a sense of pride in what has been achieved and with optimism for what lies ahead.

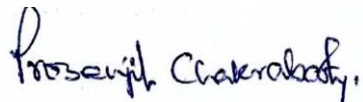
