

TRAVEL GRANT - GAABESU LAUNCHES A NEW PROGRAM

GAABESU have long been active in raising funds to aid fellow alumni, students, faculty members for multiple purposes including helping students to attend and/or present their research to the national and international technical conferences and seminars. Further, after formation of IIEST, GAABESU will look forward more towards these type of student benefit related activities. The main motivation of the scheme primarily is to promote "academic excellence with a focus on quality research" in the institute.

This program is solely intended for the present students of IIEST, Shibpore. Partial assistance will be provided to attend national/international events of repute. These would include seminars, conferences, innovative design competitions, research paper presentation and receiving of awards of international repute (only if the work was done at IIEST, Shibpur or the awardee is the principal investigator of the work), international students' summit etc, subject to certification by IIEST respective department head and acceptance by GAABESU.

This program will not discriminate any person based on location, age, sex, race and political inclination and/or affiliation. All cases will be treated equally for the overall process and the award will depend on the available financial resources of GAABESU. Selection will be done on a first-come-first-serve basis.

GAABESU will constitute a committee to finalize the award of the grant. GAABESU shall consolidate all the available funds for this purpose and also seek further donations from Alumni, so as to be able to start with a dedicated fund of at least Rs. Fifteen lakhs (Rs. 15,00,000/-). It will be endeavoured to increase the fund upto Rs.1 Crore within next three years. The funds will be kept as fixed deposits in a nationalized bank account. GAABESU shall use upto maximum of 90% of the yearly interest accrued from the funds. Principal amount will be kept untouched.

The grant shall be partial for the total expense. The applying student shall show that the fund received from other sources is not sufficient for his/her travel, lodging, and daily expenses to attend the conference.

The support available from GAABESU shall not exceed 50% of the total eligible Travel and Conference cost. The maximum amount of a grant shall not exceed INR 50,000.00 (or its USD equivalent) for a trip abroad, outside of South Asia for students / INR 10,000.00 for a trip within South Asia. The assistance will only be reimbursed after the applicant submits statement of expenditure after expiry of the event. GAABESU may consider the requirements in case of an exceptionally needy students.

The fund will not support Paid or unpaid internship/workshops, any local event organized by students or research scholars, expenses other than travel, boarding & lodging and attendance at any type of event other than those mentioned above.

Anandamoy Chatterjee, a 3rd year student of Electronics and Tele-communication department of IIEST, Shibpur is invited by Radio Frequency and Millimeter (RFM) Group at IMEC-LAHC Institute of Microelectronics, Electro-magnetism and Photonic Institute, Grenoble, France for a 10 weeks program starting from 4th May, 2015. He will receive a monthly stipend of 510 euros.

U OF WINDSOR & IIEST, SHIBPUR COLLABORATION CONTINUES

Our Distinguished alumnus, Nihar Biswas, Ph.D., P.Eng., FCSCE, Distinguished University Professor, Civil and Environmental Engineering, University of Windsor, Canada is leading collaboration between his Alma Mater and present employer for more than a decade.

Over the past few years, collaborative research work has been ongoing between Professor Narayan Kar from the University of Windsor and Professor Kaushik Mukherjee, Department of Electrical Engineering, Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology, Shibpur, Professor Mukherjee came to Windsor in 2011 as a visiting Professor and spent one year with Dr. Kar and co-supervised several Master's and doctoral students. This collaboration is now continuing and recently, Mr. Lakshmi Varaha Iyer, a doctoral student of Dr. Narayan Kar from the University of Windsor, started his laboratory work in Dr, Mukherjee's laboratory at IIEST, Shibpur. He is one of several graduate students who is being cosupervised by Drs. Mukherjee and Kar, jointly. Iyer's research with Prof. Mukherjee is being supported by the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada (NSERC) under the Michael Smith Foreign Study Supplements Program. This is a prestigious award granted to selected Canadian graduate students.

lyer has been continuing his work on design of three-phase interior permanent magnet synchronous machines (IPMSMs) for direct drive electric vehicles. At IIEST, he has developed a new approach based on maximizing power output below and above base speed to design such three-phase machines which satisfy both the constant power and constant torque regimes in electric vehicles. A down-scaled version of this machine is also being prototyped. Direct drive electric vehicles are expected to add considerable

benefit to battery-to-wheel efficiency of the vehicle eliminating the conventional transmission losses. However, removal of the existing transmission needs a superior performance motor with cost and size considerations that can provide high torque at starting and operate at low and high speeds/loads conditions with enhanced efficiency. He is currently conducting research to mathematically model sixphase IPMSM and propose a novel machine design approach for six-phase IPMSM. Such a multi-phase machine is expected to improve performance characteristics such as fault tolerance, torque ripple, efficiency and peak power rating of IPMSMs in direct drive electric vehicles.

JINDEGI NA MILEGI DOBARA: SCRIPT REWRITTEN (PART 2 OF 3)

Today's journey to Tshoka started well. With a lasting impression of yesterday's over exercised day. Within the serene nature of Himalayas, with humming sound of continuously flowing spring/waterfall/rivulet somewhere downhill. This sound sometimes become very prominent after crossing some bend in hilly trek trail. Other time it fades away like a distant low background humming noise. Trails are mostly hairpin trail. That is when we are to climb or descend sharply. We crossed the last/fourth bridge. Never ending ascent started. By now we were out of all mobile ranges. One good thing we noticed. All of us are very much acquainted with our mobile phones in our



everyday life but none of us was missing phone rings at all. Moreover, we were feeling much relaxed that we are not to respond regular calls etc.. It is a liberating feeling. Surly enjoyable. While having this tough trek which is one of the toughest trek in India, I found that human body is having a factor of safety, like what we have in design of structures, much more than it is apparent. In particular my legs were very cooperative. On the contrary my lungs & heart were not able to cope up with my legs. Slow, limited ascent was making my lungs breathless & heart pumping hard. I rediscovered my pace of ascent. I followed signals of my body. And complied like an obedient husband. Ascent was slow but steady. I did not try to copy pace of any other compatriot. I was slowest of them all but that did not bother me at all. My competition is with me only, none else. This kept me going. By mid-day we reached Bakhim.



Last time we stayed here in our first night of trek. There is a forest rest house. We have seen that this time as well. Still standing but in dilapidated condition. We went to the upstairs room where we stayed in the night last time. Part of the floor is missing creating a big hole. We could see the same fire place. Few cots are there. Without mattress. Doors & windows broken, missing. Stair does not look strong. We captured few snaps of this building, as part of our old memory still standing. We still could remember the frantic condition we were in at later

part of first day's trek last time. We were totally on our own. Could not afford to have, guide, horse/yak, porters not even tents! All luggage including dry foods for entire trek duration was distributed, shared & loaded in our rucksacks! We did not have any means to have cooked/hot food. In our first day we reached Bakhim. We did not have any other choice also. There was & is no Trekkers hut or rest house in between Yuksam & Bakhim. During the afternoon, I still remember, it started raining. Visibility became poor. We were only human being seen for last few hours together. Not knowing whether we are on the right trail or not. Day light was fast receding. Rain was incessant. However, rain in upper heights generally does not happen like in plains. We see it rains cats & dogs in plains but not in heights. We had started cursing ourselves for taking a decision of coming to trek in God forsaken place. Which is good for nothing and will fetch absolutely nothing! We were drenched till last part of our undies. It was a cumulative effect of sweating & drizzling. We almost lost hope of reaching a shelter for night and preparing ourselves to spend entire night outside in jungle with wild animals & leeches. From the morning we had been attacked by numerous leeches. I was attacked two places above ankle. And surprisingly one leach invaded through neck of my T shirt and positioned in my belly! As a precaution we carried salt to get rid of leeches. Salt does a magical reaction from leeches. It loses the grip and squeezes itself. I am not sure whether it gets killed by salt or not. But for sure we get relieved! By that time we started losing hope of coming back in a single piece after the then trek....... We heard a "Eureka" from a distance. One of us has spotted the forest rest house ahead. It was Bakhim's Forest rest house.

This time while going & coming back we did not encounter a single leech. There was a separate care takers hut beside. Who agreed to provide us food for that night? It was a real relief to us after a long



strenuous unusual day. We dumped our rucksacks in the wooden floored rest house on the first floor. No electricity. As far as I remembered we slept on floor on that night. Inside sleeping bags. There was a fire place which is seen by us this time also. Temperature was right for lighting it but we did not have energy left with us for that venture. This time we took a small break in care takers hut. He served us tea.



We went on to Tshoka. We reached Tshoka after 14:00 hrs. We found all tents for sleeping are erect. Toilet is available & a place for dining too on the other side little far off. So those tents are not used. Had a warm lunch. Tried to take a nap to energize myself. Others kept on chit chatting, playing poker with chips. We got a view of snow-capped mountains just before sunset. Tried to take few snaps with my SLR on stand. Nothing impressive was captured. One thing I realized after starting photography that what naked eye can see, it is next to impossible to capture in any camera. We had a late afternoon tea. Had dinner little early like last night. After dinner we sat outside tents in dark night, as moon was expected after midnight only; it was a week after full moon. One of us sang few melodious songs without any instrument which made the evening a heavenly one. This evening became one of the best evening we spent together. Our nostalgia took a U turn in life &

taken us back to those College days in last century. A miraculous time machine effect! Night spent peacefully.
