FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

VC Selection – My thoughts

(This was written before we learnt that the selection committee sent the names to the Higher Education Dept., WB, already. We will soon find out if the new VC is any different from the ones in the recent past.)

The tenure of the present VC will expire at the end of this month. A three-member committee has been set up with two elected by BESU Court and one by WB Government (WBG) that will recommend names to the Higher Education Department of WB. In this connection, one should look at the report to be submitted by Yash Pal (former UGC Chairman) Committee, set up by the MHRD to critically review the selection process of VCs in the Central Universities. The committee concluded, "An independent process of appointing vicechancellors is key to ensuring the autonomy of our higher education institutions. At present, our universities are autonomous only on paper." Looking back at the past few VCs (since Dr. Sen relinguished his position), it is understandable why the conclusions of the said committee stating "This current process ensures that those who wish to become VCs must be friendly to the ministry. It is impossible to expect them to be autonomous in their functioning as their presence as VC itself depends on the ministry," is equally applicable to the selection process of VCs in WB.

In the western world, the committee members to select "President of the Universities" come from a wider section of the public (from deans/senior administrators/alumni & student representatives/ board of regents). The nominations are sought by the committee and they screen the candidates based on academic excellence, administrative experience and recommendation letters. The selected candidates are invited to the campus and they meet deans, faculties/ students and the selection committee members. Based on the input from all, the selection committee chooses a "President."

It is quite obvious that the process strongly criticized by Yash Pal committee in selecting VCs of Central Universities has been used by WBG to select last few VCs at BESU. In view of this report, can we request the committee formed to recommend VC for BESU to be objective and transparent in the selection process and addresses the issues raised in the said report?

In our mind, the committee should consider the following criteria in recommending the name of next VC to the Higher Ed Department who will then forward the name to the University Chancellor for approval (a mere formality):

 Academic excellence should be at the top. Academic excellence should be judged on the basis of research carried out by the candidate and papers published in peer-reviewed journals. The

candidate should preferably be member of one of the National Academies. It is preferable that he has strong background in Engineering or Applied Science and has been associated with a reputed technical institution.

- 2) Next in order must be administrative experience. Normally, the Presidents in US are chosen from the deans of schools. The deans are top administrators of a school, to whom all its department heads report. Deans or Deputy Directors in IITs in India are people with somewhat similar administrative experience. Top administrators in National Research Laboratories who are normally technical people and/or head of the department of any engineering branch from reputed institutes are other such candidates.
- 3) In USA, fund-raising capability is a very important factor in selecting President. Although, it is less important in India, still the VC must be comfortable in dealing with alumni, industrialists and philanthropists so that he can convince them to donate money to the school.
- 4) The position of VC at BESU is 24/7 job and the VC must be willing to reside within the campus to take immediate action in case of any emergency. Anybody who wants a 10 AM to 5 PM job must not be hired as VC of BESU. Absence of VC in campus has prolonged student unrest and mishandling of unrest by the administration has caused the loss of INI status to BESU for the time being.

The committee members are, I am sure, fully aware of how the selection process has been carried out since Dr. B.Sen retired and how devastating, the selection has been to BESU (We just learnt that MHRD will not be converting BESU to an INI because of its poor governance.). BESU was once a top-tier technical institution in India and aspires to be top-tier (INI) again. To prepare for the transition from a provincial institution to an INI, the selection committee is urged to choose an eminent academician with administrative experience if they really care for the future of technical education in WB. It is often said that "Good policy is good politics" and as such, the committee will serve the WBG well if it selects a well-regarded academic as VC without caring if s/he is obedient to the ruling political masters.

Seminar by Prof. Peter Hagedorn at BESU

Prof. Peter Hagedorn, Professor, Technical University Darmstadt, Germany visited the University on 21.01.2009. He delivered a lecture on the current and future directions of research in the general area of Mechanics in the seminar room of the Department of Mechanical Engineering at 1:30 PM and interacted with the faculty members of the University.

Dr. Peter Hagedorn, Professor, Dynamics and Vibrations Group, Department of Mechanical Engineering Technische Universitat Darmstadt has over 200 publications which include papers in international journals, refereed conferences, book chapters, lecture notes and books. He has 7 patents to his credit. He has taught various courses such as Vibrations of Continuous Systems, Machine Dynamics, Multi-body Dynamics, Statics, Theory of Elasticity, and Dynamics. He has been a Visiting Professor at COPPE, Rio de Janeiro (Brazil), Lecturer at University of Karlsruhe (Germany), Research Fellow at Stanford University (US), Visiting Professor at UC Berkeley (US), Universities in Paris (France), Irbid (Jordan) and Christchurch (New Zealand). He has also served in various positions (Director of the Institute of Mechanics, Dean and Vice-President) at TU Darmstadt.

Dr. Jitendranath Kar ('53CE), CE Department

With heavy heart, we would like to inform you that Dr. Jitendra Nath Kar, retired professor of Civil Engineering, is no more with us. On Jan 25th (Sunday) he passed away at around 9 P.M. due to sudden cardiac arrest. After receiving his BE, Dr. Kar went to IIT (Kharagpur) to get his M.Tech and Ph.D.degrees. He taught there for few years and returned to BE College around 1964 as Associate Professor. He was a very sincere teacher and well-liked by all. We will miss him. May his soul rest in peace!

Mr. Pankaj Chatterjee ('51CE)

Pankaj Chatterjee passed away on Dec 31st, 2008 in his residence at New Alipore, Kolkata. He was kind of a rare individual with a friendly face and amiable nature. As a professional working in WB Govt., his was also a rare success story. Starting as an Asst. Engineer in PH Engg., he crossed the borders of Asst. Engineer and Executive Engineer quickly. As Superintending Engineer in Ranigunge Coalfield Area (RCFA) Water Supply Scheme, apart from performing his own duties, he formed formidable football and cricket teams which participated in local tournaments with reasonable success. There, he successfully persuaded Patterson Engineering Co., responsible for constructing the Water Treatment Plant in RCFA, to build an Inspection Bungalow with flower garden and swimming pool in Kalyaneswari without additional cost. This demonstrated his capability in handling a private company to his employers (the State PWD and I & W Depts.).

Later on, he was deputed to CMDA as Director, Water Supply. He eventually rose to be the Director General, Operations (PH) there. After retiring from CMDA, he joined Sulabh International as an Advisor and remained there till his death. In addition, he worked with UNDP for two years providing technical advice to the Govt. of Bangladesh.

He left behind his wife, a son and daughter-in-law besides innumerable friends and well wishers. Institute of Public Health Engineers (India) with whom, he was associated as President for several years arranged a memorial meeting on Feb 20, 2009 in its HQ Office at CK 58, Salt Lake.
