### FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

### Roles of GAABESU and Local Associations vis-a-vis BESU

Although one of the reasons for the formation of GAABESU was to give a hand to the BESU administration (which they did not care to seek) for a grand celebration of its150<sup>th</sup> anniversary, its main purpose has been to help the Alma Mater in all possible ways so that it can regain its past reputation. There are numerous Alumni Associations of BESU throughout the world. Most members of such associations care for the welfare of the institute. In the past, a few of them have raised money for developmental works. Recently class of 1979 raised money to renovate a section of baby Slater Hall, to be used for extra-curricular activities.

However, it is difficult for individual small entities to undertake any big project due lack of resources. As there was no central organization that could coordinate all smaller entities and undertake bigger projects, GAABESU was formed to fill this void. Some associations unfortunately have not been receptive to this idea as they thought they will lose their independence if they join this global organization. Local Associations and GAABESU have different roles.

Local associations are mainly involved with the alumni in a particular community and arrange get-togethers, reunions, etc. They run their associations the way they see fit and do not have to follow the rules and regulations of GAABESU. GAABESU does not have any intention to be involved with their activities and dictate them.

Although local associations take pride in being a part of once-great institution, most of them do not show any interest to help the Alma mater which has been going through difficult time for the last 15-20 years. GAABESU hopes that the local associations would take interest in the welfare of the Alma mater and work with GAABESU to improve the condition of BESU. Since its formation, GAABESU has been successful in helping our Alma Mater in a larger scale. From yearly about 10 scholarships/year, GAABESU is providing close to 100 different scholarships amounting to almost Rs.10 lakhs for the last three/ four years.

In the most recent campaign to raise money for the documentary film by eminent director Mr. Buddhadeb Dasgupta, GAABESU has raised about Rs. 10 lakhs in less than three months. In addition, GAABESU will contribute between Rs 20 lakhs & 25 lakhs towards the renovation of the swimming pool which is in a very bad condition. It should be noted that GAABESU has also raised about Rs. 4.5 lakhs to partially fund (50%) the Guest Chair at BESU in two weeks. All of these show that we can achieve a lot in improving the infrastructure as well as the academic environment at BESU if we all work together.

It is my fervent hope that all alums irrespective of their involvement in local associations, will join GAABESU to make it stronger & effective. If one cares for the Alma Mater, he/she should work with GAABESU to make BESU a better place.

## **BESU ACTIVITIES**

### University-CII Collaboration Conference

The Bengal Engineering and Science University (BESU) and CII organized a two-day university-industry council symposium with the theme 'Industry-Academia Collaboration for Quality Human Resource and R&D towards Sustainable Economic & Social Development'. Besides industry leaders and vice-chancellors, deans and professors from various universities, panelists from foreign universities in Israel, Singapore and Australia also attended this meet to share their experiences in industry-academia partnerships.



BESU came up with a national level Innovation Centre to provide a platform for inter-disciplinary teaching and research. This was the first time a state university in West Bengal ventured into innovation, fusing various technologies and aimed to produce Intellectual Property Rights and patents on such a large-scale. The Innovation Centre was managed by experts from the academia and the industry. It will act as a nodal centre for local, national and international collaborations. A separate building will be dedicated to the centre where students will take part in discussions and experiments. Its foundation was laid by Mr. Kapil Sibal, Union minister for Human Resource and Development at the University on August 1.

The University Vice-Chancellor, Ajoy Kumar Ray, said the centre will work on local, regional and national level. Each Local Innovation Centre will be provided with a separate Intellectual Property Rights office. On the first day of the fourth CII University-Industry Council Symposium held at the Bengal Engineering and Science University (BESU), universities from Australia, Singapore and Israel evinced keen interest to collaborate with their counterparts in the state. Representatives of Deakin University, Melbourne, said they will involve post-graduate students of BESU in various research projects in Australia. The university is likely to take the first batch of students from 2010. Some foreign universities are also keen on involving PhD

and doctorate students in various projects in their universities. YS Rajan, Principal Advisor, CII expressed that the model was an emerging one, where the foreign universities that want to get into research with the CII industries can do so without getting into a university-to-university only link. #### National Workshop on Power Electronics at BESU

### Arsenic Remediation Guest Research Initiative

For four weeks in June three students from the University of Pennsylvania lived and worked at Bengal Engineering & Science University in Kolkata, India to contribute towards solutions for contamination of drinking water by arsenic, an invisible and slowacting poison which is destroying lives of rural residents of West Bengal and the neighboring country of Bangladesh.

The Penn students, Alison Mora, Matt Owens, and Haresh Tilani are all pursuing degrees in both the Engineering and Business schools at Penn. Alison and Matt brought prior experience working with Arsenic filtration from a senior design project completed this past spring in partnership with the Penn spin-off materials science company Innova Materials. Haresh and Matt have worked in past years on water projects in Honduras and Cameroon as members of Penn's Engineers Without Borders Chapter.

### An Appeal to Donate for the Documentary Fund

Our beloved Alma Mater, 2<sup>nd</sup> oldest Engineering College in India, is 153 years old now. It started at the Writers' Building and moved to the present site after passing through the Presidency College campus. The present site used to be historic Bishop's College campus where Michael Madhusudan Dutta studied. Since it moved to this location, the campus has gone through enormous changes.

Barracks were replaced by hostels and a few hostels subsequently became classrooms. Downing Hall has become Staff quarter whereas Pandya Hall that housed post-graduate students is now Lady's Hostel.

Our Alma Mater has a long and rich history. Unfortunately, the great traditions of this institute and the history of the changes at the campus have not been formally recorded and as such, are not even known to lot of alums where they have spent probably the best several years of their lives. In addition, a lot of students while selecting school to pursue engineering program are not aware of BESU's rich history, its contribution to the engineering education in India and what it means to attend this great institute and be known as BESU alum. In order to make every member of the BESU community aware of its rich heritage, the administration has decided to make a documentary on our beloved college and make it available to the community.

This documentary will include past history of the institute from the days gone by, its contribution in imparting engineering education in India and a glimpse of the campus life in a typical academic year, seen through the eyes of an artist. BESU administration requested the eminent movie director, Mr. Buddhadeb Dasgupta, to take responsibility of this task which he has graciously agreed. Mr. Dasgupta has planned to make a 40-minute video documentary on our Alma Mater. He has already shot a no. of events at the campus and plans to do more as year progresses. It will cost about INR 15 lakhs to complete the project.

However, government money is not available to fund such projects. In absence of Government sponsorship for this activity, we see two options - seek out private funding and/or seek out help from our alums. As private funding may come with restrictions that may compromise the integrity of the institute, we feel, it is better if alums sponsor this activity.

All alumni/ alumnae will have an opportunity to be a part of this historic event. In addition, each alumnus/alumna may get Income Tax benefit (where applicable) for their generous donation. BESU administration also plans to acknowledge donors in the video based on the contributions made (at least USD 100.00 for NRI alums from Western Countries, at least INR 2000.00 for alums in the Middle-East and at least INR 1000.00 for alums from the sub-continent) and provide a copy of the video.

We, on behalf of the University and Global Alumni Association, request all alumni/alumnae to generously donate for this unique project that will trace back to the past and preserve the history for the future generations. Please donate generously. We are counting on your generosity.

# S.S. Chakraborty, FNAE, '57CE delivers Special Lectures

Under the AICTE-INAE distinguished Visiting Professorship Scheme, Mr. Sudhangshu S. Chakraborty, Fellow, National Academy of Engineering, and Chairman-cum-Managing Director, Consulting Engineering Services (India) Private Limited delivered Special Lectures at BESU, Shibpur; one on September 1 in the evening and the second one on September 2 in the morning at the Alumni Seminar Hall, Science and Technology Building.

On the first day he talked in the area of "Seamless Engineering. He said that Leveraging expertise across disciplines underpins "seamless engineering". A holistic approach promotes knowledge-diversity, and motivates cross-fertilization, beyond engineering partitions.

On the second day, his topic was "Emerging Areas in Engineering". He told the gatherings described how engineering emerges through a fusion of engineering issues, business matters and social concerns. Engineers may look at the issues through the prisms of various securities: habitat, food, energy, water, climate and others. Adopting "Green Building" concepts, which focus on resource consumption, energy efficiency and minimizing waste generation, lead to building sustainable habitats.

# Dr. Nihar Biswas' ('70CE) team helps cut pollution flow to Detroit River

Under the direction of Dr. Nihar Biswas who is the University Professor and Sr. Associate Dean, a team of students and faculty researchers of the University of Windsor with some help from Stantec Consulting, found a better method of treating the mix of storm and sewage water from the City of Widsor that often overflows into the Detroit River during heavy storms, thus saving money and cutting down pollution flow.

Crews will install a massive retention treatment basin under the parking lot on Riverside Drive, said Greg St. Louis, a project manager with the city and one of Biswas' former students. The project, funded in part by the Canadian Government's federal infrastructure stimulus plan, will cost about \$60 million, but could have been twice as much if not for the University's involvement, St. Louis said.

Currently, a sewer interceptor system captures the effluent, and pipes that to the Lou Romano treatment facility on the city's west end. During heavy rainfall, however, the system often overflows and the effluent spills over into the river. St. Louis said that happens close to 50 times a year.

The new basin, which St. Louis said will be about the size of a football field, will dramatically cut down on those overflows. Biswas' team improved the design of the basin and refined a process that relies on polymers to separate the sewage, forcing the heavy solids to settle to the bottom and the cleaner water to the top. If there are any overflows into the river, it will be the cleaner water, while the solids are pumped out to the treatment facility.

Tarun Kumar Basu, '54 CE (1929-2009) Reported by Arun Deb, '57CE

With great sadness, I would like to announce that our beloved Tarun Kumar Basu 1954 CE, of Salt Lake Kolkata passed away on 10 August, 2009 at a Kolkata hospital.

Tarun Kumar Basu was born in Kolkata in 1929. After graduation from Bengal Engineering College in 1954 in Civil Engineering, he spent his entire professional career working for the Public Health Engineering Department of the Government of West Bengal. He came to the United States of America a couple of times on WHO Fellowships. He retired as a Chief Engineer of Calcutta Municipal and Sanitation Authority (CMWSA). He was one of our earlier members of GAABESU and was very enthusiastic about all alumni issues. He was a very active member of the Salt Lake B. E. College Ex-Students Club. Tarun-da was a perfect gentleman and always extended helping hand to his friends and fellow alumni. He was an avid Bridge Player and won many trophies and prizes.
