The VoIP Trial- First Time in India (School Bell Project)

During a visit to the BESU campus in January 2011, Sumitra Sinha ('79ETC and GAABESU EC member) was thinking if it will be possible to establish a new communication laboratory using one of the latest technology, VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol).

She wanted to help her Alma Mater by way of introducing this new technology to the BESU students so that they can learn and explore this area of telecommunication and most importantly gain some hands-on experience with the VoIP project experiments.

As a Senior VoIP Architect at AT&T, Sumitra had worked with Ms. Carol Davids, an industry leader and Professor of Illinois Institute of Technology (IIT), Chicago, for her Tele-communication research projects. Professor Davids has already developed a VoIP lab in her college campus of IIT. Sumitra teamed up with Professor Davids to introduce the very first VoIP project so both the institutions can help each other and make inter-campus phone calls over VoIP technology.

Ms. Sinha described the VoIP project to the students and challenged the then third year (current final year) students of Electronics and Telecommunication, who were passionate, to do something off the curriculum for the amelioration of the university. The brief introduction of VoIP was followed by strong support provided by Prof. Ajay Kumar Roy, VC and Prof. Arabinda Ray, HOD, Electronics and Telecommunication Department who urged every student to contribute to the progress of the project.

With the basic introduction of the VoIP project, the VoIP Laboratory was set up at BESU when the administration allotted Laboratory space.

The BESU and IIT, Chicago team were situated at two opposite ends of the globe; however, the distance was not a barrier for the students.

The entire class was divided into five groups who worked coherently to achieve the goal successfully. It was Rakesh Tripathi, a student of the same class, who was given the most precious onus of leading the entire company. Apart from that there were five sub-leaders leading each group. Next task was to get the pre-requisites from the other end i.e. receiving the training materials and VoIP documents from Carol Davids, Director of VoIP Research Lab IIT, Chicago. Once those were received, all the groups got involved in reviewing them and getting things clarified. A timeline was proposed which was broadly met throughout the peregrination. Internet speed was drastically improved to support the transmitting voice call over internet. Progress of the project was regularly reported to Prof. Davids and IIT team through Skype calls. Trixbox server was installed in the computers available in the IMPACT laboratory, which has been operating successfully. The

first successful results were obtained when an intra-department call was perfectly carried out in March, 2011. A virtual presentation was exhibited on "Student Colloquium on Real Time Communication" sponsored by IEEE, Chicago Section. Currently the team is working on installing requisite servers and different components of the "VoBESU" system in the newly formed "VoIP" lab in the fourth floor of the department. India's first ever fully dedicated VoIP lab is all set to get off in style by early January, 2012 when Sumitra revisits her Alma Mater.

GAABESU Scholarship & Research Fellowships

GAABESU's annual "Scholarship and Research Award Distribution Ceremony 2011-12" was held at the Alumni Seminar Hall on 26th November, 2011 between 4:30 PM – 6:30 PM. GAABESU Scholarship Sub-Committee announced the names of the Scholarships and Book Grant winners. Each scholarship pays Rs 12,000 except a few that pay Rs 6,000.

Each research award pays Rs 15,000 in 2011-12, and is expected to increase further in the subsequent years. GAABESU fellowships for excellence (in academic, sports and leadership) will be announced in early January 2011. Including all grants and awards (admission grants, scholarships, book grants, research awards and fellowships for excellence), GAABESU is paying nearly Rs 13 lakhs for 2011-12. This money has been raised from our global alumni and well-wishers.

The goal of the admission grants, scholarships and book grants is to help financially needy students to pursue studies at our Alma Mater. The goal of research award is to promote academic research while pursing studies whereas goal of fellowship in excellence is to promote extra-curricular activities (sports, leadership) and academics. We hope you will join us helping present students (and future alumni) to pursue all round excellence while spending their formation years at our Alma Mater.

FCRA Approval

It was reported that FCRA approval (allowing GAABESU to accept donations in foreign currency without any restrictions) dated September 1, 2011 mentioning the Registration number from the Ministry of Home Affairs has been received by GAABESU. Pratik Dutta, Treasurer is working on the compliance communiqué and the future course of action at the GAABESU end.

80G Approval

Syama Datta reported the status of 80G (allowing alums in India to claim tax-exemption for the donations) approval and informed the EC members that the approval is expected within a week.

Swimming Pool

The pool work was suspended after some of the pool tiles came out possibly due to heavy accumulation of rainwater in the pool immediately after laying of the tiles. Continuous dry spell not being available for a long time, work could not proceed. It was decided that instead of patch resetting of tiles, all the tiles from the floor would be removed and complete resetting will be done and the contractor agreed. Removal of tiles, a time consuming job, has been completed. The floor is being inspected closely to set the right bed for the tiling work. Resetting will be done after that and may take about 15 days. Completion of work inside pool including floor lighting work will take at least another 5 days.

Structural work, brick work and plaster of the change room as well as the septic tank and rear boundary wall have all been completed. Finishing work and sanitary plumbing work have just started. Deck tiling work will start shortly. Electrical work of change room is yet to start. Pumps and the filtration plant for the swimming pool have already been completed. Boundary wall on two sides and the front have not yet started.

Mr. Amitabha Ghoshal is coordinating the work. No timeframe for completing the work has been set. Based on the progress of the activities, the completion date will be determined. In the next meeting, a timeframe and possible completion date will be announced and another update with photograph will be provided.

National Power Electronics Conference

The National Power Electronics Conference 2011 (NPEC 2011) is the 5th biennial conference of the Power Electronics community in India, focusing on the ongoing research in this area and seeking to find potential users of the laboratory-scale developments in the industry. This biennial event was launched in 2003 October at IIT Bombay, and held at IIT Kharagpur in December 2005, at IISc Bangalore in December 2007, at IIT Roorkee in June 2010. The present version of NPEC will be held in December 2011. The objectives of the conference are to provide a forum to promote and accelerate high quality research inviting professional interactions for the advancement and indigenisation of Power Electronics in India. Papers with up-todate research results are encouraged for submission. Specifically, papers having significant experimental results to validate the propositions will be given preference. Technical papers will be accepted for presentation after peer review. The pre-conference tutorials will be held on December 19, 2011. Apart from these plenary sessions, keynote lectures and invited talks will also be held.

The country's industry, research establishments and academia are cordially invited to the event at the erstwhile Bengal Engineering College (or B.E. College) which presently stands as Bengal Engineering and Science University, Shibpur, Howrah. Also of note, is that the Department of Electrical Engineering is simultaneously celebrating its Centenary year.

Arnab Mandal, 2008 IT

Arnab has been selected as one of the winners of MIT Climate CoLab Contest 2011. This year, the theme of the contest was Green Economy and was organized by MIT Center for Collective Intelligence.

Arnab's proposal was "Dream for a Green Future" on an Indian context. It was the only team from Asia to reach upto this level. Winning ideas will be published by MIT. Winners will be invited to the UN Headquarters, New York and US Congress, Washington DC for idea sharing sessions.

Prior to this, the proposal went through multiple screenings and was selected as one of the final entries to the MIT Climate CoLab Contest 2011, an event of MIT Center for Collective Intelligence. There were a total of eight short-listed entries in the final voting round with three in the Global and five in the National Category. Ultimately four winners, two each from Global and National Categories were chosen. The rules say that a winner in each category will be selected on the basis of voting and another by the judges. Winners will be invited to present their ideas to the UN Headquarters and US Congress in January 2012.

This year their main question was regarding green economy: "How should the 21st century economy evolve bearing in mind the risks of climate change?" Arnab wrote the proposal for the National Category, which focuses on national economy (India). You can visit the links below for details:

Ashok Kumar Chakraborty breathed his last at AMRI Hospital, Salt Lake, Calcutta around 6:45 A.M. on Oct. 23, 2011. Hailed from

Baruipur (South 24 Parganas), a small hamlet on the fringe of Calcutta, he joined B.E. College in the year of 1973.

He joined P.W.D., Govt. of West Bengal in November 1980 and rose to the rank of Superintending Engineer at the time of his sudden demise due to ailments in his colon. It came like a bolt from the blue to all. His leadership quality, personal rapport with Engineers as well as a cross-section of people contributed largely while handling many important projects like Underground Car Park in B.B.D. Bag and Ten storied New High Court Building. He was also instrumental in building a new block in the courtyard of Writers' Buildings to house the Office of the Chief Govt. Architect, PWD.

Soft spoken and well-mannered Ashok was popular for his amiable personality, which used to inspire his team-mates. Successful arrangement of two prestigious mega-events also added feathers to his cap – one is 69th Annual Session of Indian Roads Congress (IRC) at Calcutta in December 2008 another is yearlong celebration of 150th Birth Anniversary of Poet Rabindra Nath Tagore under the banner of "Rabindra Janma Sardha Shatabarsha Udjapan Committee" formed by Officers & employees of P.W.D. & P.W.D.(Roads) Department.

In the former event as Convener, Logistics Subcommittee he played a key role in all the construction & decoration work for presenting the IRC venue in a nice manner. In the later event, he was the torchbearer and as its General Secretary he himself mostly shouldered the bulwark of the entire event. Nirmalya R Das, 1960 EE

Nirmalya Ranjan Das, our fellow alumnus, breathed his last on October 7th, 2011 around 7.00 A.M. at Kasturba Gandhi Hospital, BHEL, Bhopal after a brief ailment. He was cremated at Bhopal. He was born in 1935 in Birbhum. After graduation, he joined Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd.
