FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

The year is coming to an end. It has been a great tradition at the US universities to call the alumni/alumnae for the year-end contributions to their *alma mater*. There are two reasons for calling the alums at this time. First, it is Holiday time as Christmas is close and everyone is in a festive as well as in a giving mood. Second, the year-end contribution to any nonprofit organization can be claimed as a deduction while filing tax return. The donations from the alumni/alumnae often constitute the biggest endowments in top-tier schools.

They donate so that their *alma mater* has enough resources to maintain top facilities and recruit extraordinary academicians so that they can attract top students. This is repeated from generation to generation. In India, IIT alumni have started this tradition by calling it "Guru Dakhsina". In ancient India, students used to go to Guru's house and study there without paying anything. At the completion of education, they used to pay "Dakhsina" to the Gurus. In engineering schools, we got education almost free and now when we are earning, is it not fair to pay "Dakhsina" to our *alma mater*?

For the fiscal year 2007, Harvard, Yale, Princeton, MIT, Columbia, U-Penn, Cornell and Dartmouth respectively raised \$614M, \$304M, \$254M, \$333M, \$913M, \$450M, \$406M and \$159M from their alumni. Their respective endowments totaled at \$34.9B, \$22.5B, \$15.8B, \$10B, \$7.2B, \$6.6B, \$5.4B and \$3.8B. In order to make BEC a world-class institution, we need to contribute. We cannot expect the government to do it for us.

Sir Winston Churchill said, "We make a living by what we get; we make a life by what we give." Few NRI alumni/alumnae are trying to follow that through their donations for the benefit of the Institute. As most alums live in India , is it too much to expect that they open up their wallets a little bit towards the same goal? Let us start now. If each of NRI alumni donates \$150/year and alumni based in India donates Rs. 1000/year, we can generate about about Rs. 2.5 Cr/year (1750x\$150 + 15000xRs.1000) . Is it a pipe dream? Wish all of you happy holidays!

2007 Mentorship Program: A Promising Beginning

Over the last few years, many current students informally sought professional and personal guidance from our alumni. To meet those needs, GAABESU launched the first mentorship program in July 2007, with the full support & commitment from the VC, Deans, PICSA, and GAABESU Executive Committee. Our target for the first year was to have 50 students and 10-15 mentors. It has been a pleasant surprise to see that in just 4 months (Aug – Nov), 85 students and 21 alumni have enrolled in the program. By analyzing the data (see website), it has been found that Civil & Mechanical Engineering students are taking advantage of the program in higher numbers compared to their counterparts in Electrical, CST or ETC. It has also been noted that North American alumni have overwhelmingly responded to be mentors. More participation from India-based alumni is required. And a surprise – more and more students (~50%) are looking to do their higher studies in India, and not abroad.

Over the next 2-3 months, feedback from the students and mentors will be sought and one or two "mentorship" talks in the college will be organized. Soma Bhadra ('98CE, Australia), Biswarup Guha ('99CE, US) & GAABESU assistants deserve special credit for their efforts in launching and administering the program. Emergency Fund Program Update

In the last two months two successful fund raising drives were completed by the Emergency Fund Committee to help the families of late Mr. Arup Ratan Ganguly (died on June 14, 2007) and Mr. Raghubir Sen (died on August 20, 2007). Fellow alumni donated generously in both cases.

An amount of Rs. 3,50,000.00 was handed over to Mrs. Ganguly so that she could maintain possession of their residencial flat at Jadavpur. This was the primary goal of this fund raising drive.

To cover the funeral expenses of Mr. Sen, fund in the amount of \$2,606.00 was raised. This was an urgent appeal and the response of our alumni was great.

Separately, friends of Kamal Das, '84CE, have raised nearly Rs. 2.5 lakhs until the first week of December to defray a portion of the medical cost. He is suffering from carcinoma of the lungs. BECAA Delhi chapter contributed to this fund drive too. Send your comments to emergency@becollege.org.

GAABESU Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Scholarship distribution ceremony were held on Oct 13, 2007 at the Alumni Seminar Room. All who applied for GAABESU scholarships and recommended by the Interview Team (BESU officials & faculty members), have been awarded scholarships & grants. As there were a number of applicants with financial need, the global alumni community was urged to sponsor additional scholarships. Our alumni community responded to the request immediately and helped to bridge the gap between high demand (97 applicants) and available scholarships (52 scholarships & 10 book grants announced on July 30). As a result of this drive, no applicant returned home empty handed. This is indeed a great accomplishment for GAABESU.

ALUMNI IN THE NEWS

Badal Sircar ('47CE)

- Based on a recent interview with Ms. Sebanti Sarkar of The Telegraph

One of our most distinguished alumni, Sudhindra Sarkar ('47CE), lives in a Dickensian house on a sinewy lane of North Kolkata. That was his identity before he burst into the theatre world in the sixties as Badal Sircar, one of post-independent Bengal's most poignant playwrights. Although he never thought of career in theatres, for some reason, he liked to read dramas from his childhood and continued it through his college-going period. His exploration of western drama began with Bernard Shaw. "Shaw was an instant favorite. I ran through most of his plays by the time I was in college – Shibpur's Bengal Engineering College. I scraped through to qualify, as a Civil Engineer but was terribly frustrated in the process. In deference to conventions, the family dreamt of me as a doctor or engineer," he wrote.

However, BE College may have subconsciously honed the playwright in Sircar. He voraciously lapped up Moliere, Sheridan and Eugene O'Neill. "Couldn't put my teeth into

Shakespeare till then. I was irresistibly drawn to the humor of Shaw and Moliere and O'Neill's grimness," wrote Sircar introspectively.

Between 1947-53, he had thrown up the construction job at Nagpur 'in desperation.' He wrapped up two civil engineering lectureships in Kolkata, a protracted one at Jadavpur University. After all these, when he finished a two-year town planning course from BE College, he at last found an academic discipline to fall in love with. For Mr. Sircar at 82, the past is coming back in many ways. In a recent interview with Ms. Sebanti Sarkar of The Telegraph, Mr. Sircar told her that he is in the midst of writing the third volume of his autobiography *Purono Kashundi* (Translation: Old Mustard Sauce), of which the first two volumes are out.

Purono Kashundi took readers on a lively jaunt through his childhood in north Calcutta, Darjeeling and Dehra Dun, and his days at BE College and Damodar Valley Corporation. Part II of Purono Kashundi narrates Sircar's experiences as a foreign student and professional in a world still nursing its wounds from colonial rule. "The third volume should be more interesting because it will feature the birth of Satabdi," said Sircar, smiling as if to say this is where *Purono Kashundi* might also reveal its pungent side in Sircar's recollections of the Bengali theatre scene. The first signs of it appear in Part II, Tapan Roy's Theatre Centre, Sombhu Mitra, Bohurupee and Nandikar find mention as well as the "disaster" that was the *Shouvanik Ebong Indrajit*.

Would he never write another play? Doesn't contemporary happenings excite him? "Yes, the Rizwanur case as reported in The Telegraph interests me. I realize this is the best time to hire the police for your dirty work. Mercenaries, if caught, would have to go to jail and run the risk of getting hung, but the worst that can happen to a policeman is a transfer," laughs Sircar, calling for tea.
