A REPORT FROM THE ALMA MATER

Bengal Engineering College is no longer a government institution affiliated to the Calcutta University! The deemed university is an autonomous institution- administratively, financially and academically. This new status provides flexibility to implement programs without bureaucratic constraints. While West Bengal Government is still the primary funding source, B.E. College is receiving funds from the University Grants Commission, other central govt. agencies and from private sources. The administration is entrusted to a Board of Governors which includes representatives from industries, faculties, students and alumni. the academic matters are now in the hands of the academic council of the college.

The new academic programs include all updated courses and semester system, two proposed new curricula - Science, and Social Science and Management, have been added to the traditional engineering and architecture; post graduate and doctorate programs are offered in nine disciplines - civil, mechanical, electrical, electronics and telecommunication, metallurgy, mining, computer science and technology, engineering mechanics, and town and regional planning. Continuing education programs are developed for the working professionals. New facilities are added which include computer and CAD/CAM stations in all engineering departments, a computer graphics laboratory in the architecture and town and regional planning department, computerized library and

accounting services, and a central computer center for research and consultancy. The World Bank is funding the improvement and modernization of laboratory facilities in the departments of computer science and technology, and electronics and telecommunication engineering.

Special emphasis is being provided to research projects and industry-institution partnership. Results have been very encouraging with securing of project grants from National Aeronautical and Space Administration (NASA) USA, Council of Scientific and Industrial Research - India, Indian Space Research Organization, etc.

The main thrust of the immediate program is a Research and Development Complex at a cost of Rs. 2.5 crores. The construction has been started with Rs. 1.0 crore provided by the West Bengal Govt. and the UGC, shared equally. The R & D complex is an interdisciplinary research center in the areas of material science, environmental science and engineering and non-conventional energy. Outside private funding sources include M.N. Dastur & Co. (Rs. 25 lakhs) for the material science center and Tata Iron & Steel Co. for the chair of the center. Industry and alumni funds are requested for the completion of the R & D complex which will enhance advanced research capabilities and B.E. College's position among the premier technical institution in India.

ALUMNI-COLLEGE PARTNERSHIP A NEW BEGINNING

Dr. Arun K. Deb's recent visit to B.E. College started a new beginning in alumni-college partnership, a commitment renewed to make B.E. College a giant among the technical universities in India. Dr. Deb's daylong meeting with Dr. Bimalendu Sen, Director, and other faculty members was open, cordial and fruitful. Dr. Deb has conveyed that B.E. College alumni residing in the USA and Canada are keen in helping the college for an all-round development, and Dr. Sen and the faculty members indicated the institution's willingness to accept any help with the terms and conditions required by the alumni association. No more bureaucratic interference from the government will create a barrier.

All development schemes are monitored through a planning and monitoring committee. B.E. College has indicated that one representative from US alumni may be included in this committee, something more than we asked for.

Dr. Sen apprised Dr. Deb about the vision of the future and various development schemes. The essential that has already begun is the R & D complex. The immediate need in this complex Material Science Center is already funded by Dastur and Tata. The next in the order of priority is The Environmental Science and Engineering Center (BSEC). Both Dr. Sen and Dr. Deb agreed to cooperate in developing this center which was identified as a main target area at an earlier meeting in the US. A *seed money* of 45-50 thousand dollars is in immediate need in establishing a chair

to head ESEC as the director. US alumni association fund donated for the chair will be deposited in an account to be operated by the US alumni committee. Funds will be released as necessary. US alumni committee will have input in selection of the chair, and monitor the center's activity as well.

There are many other programs that could be made effective through this college-alumni partnership. The programs will be reviewed by the US alumni committee for future funding, such as improvement of the college library, research and faculty exchange program. A Faculty Committee has been established with Dr. Suman Dasgupta as chairperson to keep constant liaison with the US Alumni Committee.

Dr. Deb briefed Dr. Sen of the alumni organization that has been formed with active participation and representation from various regions of the USA and Canada. The goal of this committee is to raise at least US\$500,000 in the next three years, which will be donated to various upcoming B.E. College development programs. Dr. Deb also advised Dr. B. Sen that US alumni will be looking forward to hands-on participation in seminars, technology transfers, and other technical and administrative areas.

Dr. Deb met Dr. Sankar Sen who is an alumnus of B.E. College (EE - '48), and presently the Energy Minister, Government of West Bengal. Dr. Sen had shown keen interest in, and appreciation of, this initiative taken by all alumni abroad.

It is now quite clear that this partnership based on understanding, trust, and cooperation between both parties will bring us to our goal.

বি ই কলেজ প্রযুক্তিতে ১২ কোটির জাপ - সাহায্য

সৌম্য সিংহ : ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং শিক্ষাব্যবস্থার সামগ্রিক উন্নয়ন এবং আধুনিকীকরণের জন্য শিবপুর বি ই কলেজ ডিমড ইউনিভার্সিটিকে ১২ কোটি টাকার প্রযুক্তিগত সাহায্য দেবে জাপান সরকার। বেশ কিছুদিন আগে বি ই কলেজ কর্তৃপক্ষ কেন্দ্রীয় সরকারের মাধ্যমে জাপান সরকারের কাছে এ ব্যাপারে একটি সুনির্দিষ্ট প্রস্তাব পাঠিয়েছিল। জাপান সরকারের সবুজ সংকেত পাবার পরে প্রতিষ্ঠানের আধুনিকীকরণ - সংক্রান্ত একটি প্রকল্পের রূপরেখাও ডিমড ইউনিভার্সিটির পক্ষ থেকে জাপানে পাঠানো হয়। এর কিছুদিনের মধ্যেই জাপান থেকে একটি বিশেষজ্ঞ দল বি ই কলেজে এসে সমগ্র বিষয়টি খতিয়ে দেখে যায় এবং ফিরে গিয়ে বিস্তারিত রিপোর্ট দেয় জাপান সরকারের কাছে। সেই রিপোর্টের ভিত্তিতেই ডিমড ইউনিভার্সিটিকে প্রযুক্তিগত সহায়তা দিতে নীতিগতভাবে রাজি হয় জাপান সরকার। এখন উভয় পক্ষের মধ্যে চূড়ান্ত চুক্তির অপেক্ষায় রয়েছে ডিমড ইউনিভার্সিটি। কথা হল ডিমড ইউনিভার্সিটির ডিরেক্টর ড. বিমল সেনের সঙ্গে। তিনি বলেন, এই ঐতিহাসিক শিক্ষা প্রতিষ্ঠানটির উন্নয়ন প্রকল্প বাস্তবায়িত করতে আগামী পাঁচ বছরে প্রয়োজন মোট ৪০ কোটি টাকা। কেন্দ্রীয় সরকার তথা ইউ জি সি এবং রাজ্য সরকার আর্থিক সহযোগিতার হাত বাড়িয়ে দিলেও এত বিশাল অঙ্কের অর্থ জোগাড় করা কষ্টসাধ্য ব্যাপার। তাছারা উন্নত প্রযুক্তির একান্ত প্রয়োজন। তাই জাপান সরকারের কাছে সহযোগিতা চাওয়া হয়েছে। জাপান অত্যাধুনিক যন্ত্রপাতি সরবরাহ করলে সেগুলি দিয়ে মেকানিকাল, ইলেক্ট্রিকালসহ প্রতিটি বিভাগের ন্যাবরেটরিগুলি নতুনসাজে সাজিয়ে তুলব আমরা। এছারা ১ কোটি টাকা খরচ করে হচ্ছে 'কমপ্লেক্স ফর ইন্টার ডিসিপ্রিনারি প্রোগ্রামস' এখানেও চাইছি জাপানি প্রযুক্তির উপস্থিতি। ভারত ও জাপান সরকার প্রকল্পটি অনুমোদন করেছে। 'ইন্দো - জাপান কমিশন অফ টেকনিক্যাল সাপোর্ট'- এর মাধ্যমে এখন কথাবার্তা চলেছে। ডিরেক্টর জানানেন, সম্প্রতি এ দেশের তিনটি পুরানো ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং শিক্ষাকেন্দ্রের ব্যাপারে জাপান আগ্রহ প্রকাশ করেছে। এর মধ্যে পুনে ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং কলেজ ইতিমধ্যেই পেতে শুরু করেছে জাপানি সহায়তা। এখন অপেক্ষায় রয়েছে বি ই কলেজ ডিমড ইউনিভার্সিটি এবং দক্ষিণ ভারতের আরো ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং কলেজ।

Bengal Engineering College University, India, has organized a workshop on total quality management (TQM) on December 22, 1994. This day-long workshop will be led by Dr. Prabir K. Bagchi. The seminar will examine the causes of decline of the western industry and discuss lessons learnt from the experiences in Japan, Europe, and the USA, and consider implementation issues in the Indian industry for revitalization and achieving global competitiveness.

বি ই কলেজ উন্নয়নে কোটি টাকা সাহায্য

আজকালের প্রতিবেদন: আমেরিকায় বসবাসকারী শিবপুর বেঙ্গল ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং কলেজের কয়েকজন প্রাক্তন ছাত্রছাত্রী এই কলেজ-বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের উন্নয়নে প্রায় এক কোটি টাকা আর্থিক সাহায্য দেবেন। অর্থ সংগ্রহের জন্য ছাত্রছাত্রীরা আমেরিকায় একটি কেন্দ্রীয় কমিটি করেছেন। কমিটির প্রেসিডেন্ট ড. অরুণ দেব। ড. দেব বিষয়টি নিয়ে কয়েকদিন আগে শিবপুর বেঙ্গল ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং কলেজ ডিমড বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের ডিরেক্টর ড. বিমলেন্দু সেনের সঙ্গে কথা বলে গেছেন। আপাতত ঠিক হয়েছে, কেন্দ্রীয় কমিটি প্রাথমিক পর্যায়ে তিনশ হাজার মার্কিন ডলার সাহায্য পাঠাবে। ছাত্রছাত্রীরা ইতিমধ্যেই আমেরিকায় অর্থ সংগ্রহের কাজ শুরু করে দিয়েছেন। তারা চেষ্টা করছেন এই সংগ্রহের অঙ্ক পাঁচশ হাজার ডলার বা পাঁচ লক্ষ ডলারে নিয়ে যেতে। এদিকে, বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ে একটি অত্যাধুনিক পরিবেশ বিজ্ঞানের ওপর 'গবেষণা কেন্দ্র' করা হচ্ছে। ইতিমধ্যেই এটির নির্মাণকাজ শুরু হয়ে গেছে। নভেম্বর মাসে উদ্বোধন হবে। রবিবার বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের ডিরেক্টর ড. বিমলেন্দু সেনকে প্রশ্ন করা হলে তিনি বলেন গবেষণা কেন্দ্রটি করতে এক কোটি টাকা খরচ হবে। রাজ্য সরকার ও বিশ্ববিদ্যালয় মঞ্জুরি কমিশন পঞ্চাশ লাখ টাকা করে দিয়েছে। তিনতলা এই বাড়িতে থাকবে পরিবেশ বিজ্ঞানের ওপর একটি প্রশিক্ষণশালা। থাকবে ল্যাবরেটরি। আর একটি ঘরে অত্যাধুনিক যন্ত্রপাতি দিয়ে গবেষণা করা হবে। জল, বাতাস থেকে শুরু করে গোটা দেশের পরিবেশ নিয়ে 'চুলচেরা' বিশ্লেষণ করবেন গবেষক ছাত্রছাত্রীরা। সেই রিপোর্টই পশ্চিমবঙ্গ সরকার ও কেন্দ্রীয় সরকারের কাছে পাঠানো হবে। সেইসঙ্গে এটির ওপর স্নাতকোত্তর কোর্সও পড়ানোর সিদ্ধান্ত নিয়েছেন কতৃপক্ষ। মেকানিক্যাল এবং সিভিল ইঞ্জিনিয়ারিং ছাত্রছাত্রীরা বিষয়টি নিয়ে এম এস সি-তে ভর্তি হতে পারবেন।

Here we have real partnership. (See the article " Alumni-College Partnership - A True Beginning.") As the center develops and funds permit, we may provide laboratory equipment, computers and other peripherals for the ESEC. We would like to help this ESEC coming off the ground. We have initiated seminars and workshops by US alumni (see Bulletin "Total Quality Management Workshop").

Our campaign goal is to raise US \$ 500,000 in three years as follows:

Sept. 94 - Aug. 95	\$250,000
Sept. 95 - Aug. 96	150,000
Sept. 96 - Aug. 97	100,000

The primary fund raising strategy is to reach each and every alumnae and alumnus living in the USA and Canada. The Suggested donation is US\$1,000 per alumnae/alumnus, payable in installments during next three years.

A personalized and customized approach will be required for donors of large sums; these donors might want to put specific conditions against their funds. The steering committee will work with those donors and the college to satisfy the desired conditions.

Philanthropic organizations, Govt. Institutions, United Nation and other sources should be vigorously approached for research funds and grants. We may organize other fund raising activities too, and always welcome good ideas and suggestions from members. Some members have already suggested that after the initial three year fund raising program, we should continue with annual donations for future years.

Initially all funds should be kept in the US no - risk interest-bearing account, or US T' bills, or similar risk free accounts. As a new program is created, funds earmarked for that program may be transferred to an Indian bank account (if higher interest rates are available) which could be controlled by B.E. College Alumni Association of USA and Canada. Funds will be released on as required basis. For the chair professor, funds may be released once or twice a year. For withdrawal and/or transfer of

funds, at least three signatures from chairman, co-chairman, treasurer, and secretary shall be required. The details of fund balances and activities will be reported periodically in the newsletters.
